MINERVA: a seated woman wearing a big hood. What is she reaching for beside her?


Did you know: Minerva was the Roman goddess of wisdom and of the arts, music and poetry; she was also associated with warfare. She is often depicted with her sacred creature, an owl; this statue doesn't have one but if you look up at the wall behind her there's another picture of Minerva: can you spot the owl?

Can you draw another one for her?

TWO PLAQUES COMMEMORATING ROYAL VISITS

Which members of the Royal Family do these plaques celebrate and which years did they come here?

Design a plaque to celebrate your visit today!



OEDIPUS: a tall thin man looking up to the sky. Do you think he looks happy or sad?

Did you know: Oedipus was a mythical king; his name means 'swollen foot' in Greek.

Can you think of an animal whose name also begins with an 'o' and ends in 'pus'? What do you think it means? You can draw one – and give it a happy or a sad face!



SPARTACUS: a dancing boy on top of a large stone. What does he have around his ankle?

Did you know: Spartacus was a Greek gladiator who led a slave rebellion against the Romans. His story has become a film, TV series and a ballet; this statue is of a Russian ballet dancer performing the role.

Copy his pose and get your friend or family to take a photo! Maybe add some more dance moves of your own?

CEILING DECORATION

Look in through the Theatre's windows either at the far right or far left of the building and look up at the ceiling. How many shapes and colours can you see?

Did you know: this abstract design uses paints that reflect the light, and echoes the colours found in the parkland and sky outside.

Choose an object in the park – maybe a leaf, a tree or a cloud – look at the shape and draw it as an abstract design.



DRESSING ROOMS

Walk round to the back of the Theatre; the windows on the first floor are the dressing rooms where actors get ready for the show.

Draw yourself in a costume or make-up: you might choose to be a queen, a witch, an astronaut or a lion!
